The Bible is the inspired and inerrant Word of God.

“All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness; so that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work” (II Timothy 3:16-17).
“... the Scripture cannot be broken” (John 10:35).

The Bible speaks to all of the social issues of our day.

“... it is the only inerrant and completely adequate source and norm of Christian doctrine and life” (1962 Declaration of Faith).
“All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness; so that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work” (II Timothy 3:16-17).

Simple and orderly worship is joyfully centered on God’s Word.

“But all things must be done properly and in an orderly manner” (I Corinthians 14:40).
“Let my tongue sing of Your word, For all Your commandments are righteous” (Psalm 119:172).

True Christian unity is based on faith in Jesus Christ and obedience to His Word.

“Sanctify them in the truth; Your word is truth. As You sent Me into the world, I also have sent them into the world. For their sakes I sanctify Myself, that they themselves also may be sanctified in truth. I do not ask on behalf of these alone, but for those also who believe in Me through their word; that they may all be one; even as You, Father, are in Me and I in You, that they also may be in Us, so that the world may believe that You sent Me.” (John 17:17-21).

Each local congregation should be free and living, subject only to the Word and Spirit of God.

“Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom” (II Corinthians 3:17).

Christians are called to be salt and light in the world.

“You are the salt of the earth. ... You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead, they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven” (Matthew 5:13-16).
